About our camp

No matter what your child's skating level is, our camp provides opportunities for all. Attending skaters shall be divided into six groups according their skating level from the very beginners trying to get to know the sport, to competitive skaters, as well as all skaters in-between.

- Group 1 – First time skaters
 - Group 2 – Basic 1 to Basic 3
 - Group 3 – Basic 4 to Basic 6
 - Group 4 – Basic 7 and above
 - Group 5 - Pre-preliminary to Pre-juvenile MIF
 - Group 6 – Juvenile to Intermediate MIF
- (based on number of participants, the levels might be combined)

The camp runs for 10 weeks through the summer from June 25, 2012 until August 31, 2012 (no classes on July 4th, 2012). We offer multiple weeks sign-up discounts, sibling discounts and an early bird discount. Full-day (8:30 AM to 3 PM) and half-day (8:30 AM to 12:30 PM) packages are available. We also understand the working parents'/care givers' needs, so an early drop-off and a late pick-up can be arranged upon request.

Equipment

Typically those who skate at level Basic 4 and above have their own equipment. While rental skates are available to the campers, your child's experience will be more satisfying if he/she has their own, properly fitted equipment. The skates do not have to be expensive, but properly fitted and sharpened. If you are planning to buy skates, please let your children walk in the laced up skates for at least five minutes to make sure that your children can walk on the skates without difficulties, before making the purchase. If your children cannot walk in the skates they will not be able to skate on them.

Instructions

Our experienced figure skating coaches and off-ice trainers provide quality instruction to skaters of all levels. Pending the participants' skating levels, we provide specialty classes such as, but not limited to: stroking, spinning, jumping, figures, ice dance.

Full-day Skaters:	Two 45-minute group lessons on ice; Two 45-minute practices on ice Two 45-minute off-ice classes (ballet, stretching, Pilates, Conditioning, Off-ice preparation) One 30-minute theory, video review
Half-day Skaters:	One 45-minute group lessons on ice One 45-minute practices on ice Two 45-minute off-ice classes (ballet, stretching, Pilates, Conditioning, Off-ice preparation)

In addition to the group lessons, private or semi-private lessons can be arranged for during the practice time. All of our coaches are members of the Professional Skaters Association (PSA). The listed coaches will be assigned to various weeks depending on the camp enrollment, and their personal schedule. Other qualified coaches participate in our program as well.

Camp Counselors will accompany the skaters to and from the scheduled activities. The counselors will be also present throughout the day to assist during lessons if needed as well as during transition times.
